## Bangor to Caernarvon and back Bangor Anglesey Y Felinheli The Menai Strait Caernarfon

For a while I had wanted to visit Caernarvon, but since the train did not go all the way down to the town I knew it would have to be by bus. I wasn't sure whether the steam train traveled all the way to pwllheli, and getting to pwllheli takes a day by train since you have to go down to shrewsbury, then along the centre of Wales to Machynlleth and then up the Cambrian coast up to Barmouth, Harlech and Porthmadog.
